

What is ADaPT?

Advancing Diversity in Physical Therapy (ADaPT) is a program designed to engage, recruit and advance diverse students into graduate physical therapy education. ADaPT provides structured opportunities for students to explore the profession of physical therapy and receive pre-admission support through the application process.

What is the Summer Scholar Experience?

This week long immersive event provides physical therapy career exploration opportunities and activities for students from diverse groups that are underrepresented in the profession. Students will stay on campus and participate in hands on workshops. Activities will include clinical observation experiences, crafting a personal statement, tips on completing a quality application and networking events with both peer and professional mentors. Students will get to interact with faculty from the #1-ranked Physical Therapy program in the country and increase the competitiveness of their future application to DPT programs.

What is included in the experience?
